Frequently Asked Questions

Most questions regarding location, programming, and international collaborators can be answered at www.pq.cz. Here are a few frequently asked questions specific to the Canadian exhibit.

Can multiple people co-apply as curator?

Yes, multiple people can apply as co-curator, however they will be required to work toward a singular vision and mandate. Their compensation will come from the same budget and should be considered and reflected in their budget sketch proposal. The signing compensation will be split amongst co-applicants.

Do I need to join the Associated Designers of Canada or be a member?

No, you will not be required to join or be a member of ADC to be considered or contracted as Curator.

Who is on the jury selection committee?

The final jury list will be published to the Associated Designers of Canada Website, no later than Aug 30th, 2025.

Who else is on the PQ team?

As curator, you have flexibility on who composes your team. As of Aug 6, 2025, you have the following team members on the project: Jo Pagnan - Producer on behalf of ADC, April Vizcko - Producer and Chair of Theatre and Producer representing the UofA, Denyse Karn - Executive Director of ADC. You will have access to contributors and interested parties who have been involved in PQ discussions for the last two years, and access to the ADC advisory committee for PQ made up of past curators, producers, and exhibitors. Do we curate the Quebec exhibit?

No, Quebec enters as a region and hosts their own curatorial process for artists of Quebec. The national exhibition are two standalone exhibitions often sharing the same exhibition floorspace. We work with QC in regards to the shared Student Exhibition. .

Does this project count as a registered charity?

Yes, funds donated to Canada PQ 27 care being made out to the Associated Designers of Canada count as registered, charitable contributions.

Is this project covered by General Liability Insurance?
